REPENTANCE: ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF WEAKNESS

Isaiah 55: 8-9 NKJV "For My thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways My ways, says the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways, and My thoughts than your thoughts."

Let us consider the parable, in Matthew 21:29-30, telling of the two sons who were asked to work in the vineyard. Both were asked to work in the vineyard. We assume that they knew the task to be done, there. The first one said, "No," but repented and then went. The next son said, "Yes sir," (Continued on Page 4.)

From this parable, we can see that one has to know what God the Father expects. Romans 5:13 says, "Where there is no law, there is no sin. "...but sin is not imputed when there is no law." Then, like the first son, in Matthew 21, we can repent, and go do the work. Or, we can choose not to do what is expected, saying we will go, but we, "go not."

In Genesis 2:15, God put the first man, Adam in the Garden of Eden, "to dress and keep it.". Adam had to know what sin was, or neither Adam, nor Eve could have sinned.

In considering the Firstborn, have you ever asked WHY GOD CLAIMED THE FIRSTBORN? IT WAS AND IS HIS PLAN. You see, Adam, was God's first son of flesh, born out of the dust. Jesus was the first-born Son, born of flesh and of the Spirit. As the first-born sons, they were required to pass along parental instructions to the younger siblings.

Consider Joseph who was the FOURTH firstborn son of Jacob. What I mean by that is that Joseph was the fourth born in the line of Jacob's sons, but he was the firstborn of Rachel.

Imagine the rivalry and hate of his siblings.

The father is the leader, symbolic priest/king of the family. The first son is to continue the legacy, first, to other children in the clan, then takes daddy's place, in time.

(Note, that God looks at the heart, and sometimes the first son was not chosen. Esau was more interested in hunting game, and doing his own thing, marrying the local women, etc.

Jacob, stayed around the camp and the tent of his father, learning from Isaac, God's way, as a good son should, so he could teach others, in time.

Going back to the vineyard parable, both sons knew what the father expected, when asked to go work in vineyard. The first son wanted to be thought good but did not do the work.

(That was Ananias and Sapphira's problem in Acts 5. They knew what God expected of them.

The first son expected reward, without work. He was a seed sown on rocky soil, without depth of roots.

When you consider the unrepentant heart of the first son, think about how many that were ever baptized without real repentance? The problem is that real repentance is not something we can discern, physically. Some people are classified as "People Pleasers". They seem to just know what to say, to please others. Some know (Continued on Page 9.)



The food prices have gone up again in Kenya. This has forced Pastor Martin to look in other areas for food. He had made an agreement with a food supplier in Uganda. Pastor Martin recently sent funds to Uganda for the June food supply, but the funds were returned and he was told that the money was not enough to buy the food he requested. Because of this, Martin was forced to look in other areas to get the best deal for the funds we send. He found a contact in Mombasa and got on a bus to travel there to work out an agreement. He travelled 15 1/2 hours, going over 1000 miles just to get to Mombasa. Mombasa is located on the East coast of Kenya and is the oldest and second largest city there with a population over one million people. Martin made contact with a food supplier who will transport the food to him each month. It is still important for us to continue supporting our brethren as we are able through prayers and offerings. They are very thankful for everything that they receive. They are still growing crops on the two acres of land, but after it has been harvested, they have to treat it, which makes it unusable for several weeks. Below are photos of Pastor

















(Repentance, Continued from Page 4.) how to deceive others, especially those in charge, to impress them. There are examples of this, in the Bible. Jesus said that Satan would sow tares among the wheat.

We should not be surprised that not all people baptized are believers, willing to do whatever the Father asks. Some do not even know what the Father asks because their hearts are not towards God. They think that all they need to do or say is whatever it takes to impress the leaders, with their powers, or great personality.

Remember how Phillip preached, and Simon Magus "believed" and was baptized. (Acts 8:13.) Did Simon believe the preaching, or was Simon impressed with the miracles and wonders which were done?

Later, Paul was preaching to ministers from Ephesus. Acts 20: 30 "Also of your own selves shall men arise, speaking perverse things, to draw away disciples after them."

What is it about Christians? Some do the work while some just want to be in charge. Then there are others who are content to do nothing, while they hope no one notices them. They do not feel qualified to do anything.

Moses did great things, yet he was meek, while God was in charge.

Peter and Paul did great things, but God was in charge. All lived lives as if Isaiah 55: 8-9 was a true statement. "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts."

They all knew about how God had thinned Gideon's army, so no one would doubt that it was God who delivered them.

Few realize that Exodus 20:2 is a very important part of the First Commandment. In fact, it is the foundation of all ten. Unless you know who God is, you will not know or care what God expects from you in the vineyard. Exodus 20:2. "I am the LORD your God, which have brought you out of the land of Egypt, and out of the house of bondage."

THE BIBLE gives two examples of the first two kings of Israel. They are examples for our learning. The first king was named Saul. The second king was named David. The first king, King Saul, did not know God, or what God desired of him. If King Saul would have listened to God, he would not have "kept the best of the captured livestock, even to offer to God. We learned in Jericho, and Achan's stolen loot, that

captured booty belongs to God, unless He says otherwise. And only the priests, or Samuel, were to present any offerings to God. King Saul never repented. He always asked Samuel to repent for him.

On the other hand, David waited years after being anointed king, to become king. And, along the way, God delivered King Saul into David's hands. Once, in a cave, and once while Kings Saul slept in the king's camp. David had the chance to take matters into his own hands and become King by his own hand. But he waited instead on God.

King Saul gave in to temptation, and took what was not his, like Lucifer, Cain, Korah, and Balaam, after him. David waited until it was his time, God's time. (Like Joseph, David was prepared to be a king.

What about us? Revelation 1:6 Those born in First Resurrection, are made "kings and priests to God," and Revelation 5:10 adds; "And have made us to our God kings and priests; we shall reign on the earth."

Mark 1:14-15. "Now after that John was put in prison, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God. 15 And saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent you, and believe the gospel." Mankind is to repent. We are to repent.

The time foretold in what we call the Old Testament, was fulfilled. So repent.

When King Saul sinned, he asked Samuel to pray for him. When David sinned, he confessed to God. David admitted that he had thought like a human, and not like God.

As early as Genesis 39, Joseph said that sin was "against God". If we think like God, we will not sin. If we slip, and sin, we can confess, our weakness, and ask God to help us think as He does and recognize our sins.

Jesus did that when the devil tempted him the three times recorded in the Gospels. TEMPTATION is not sin. Yielding to temptation reveals to us our weaknesses and can become sin. Repentance is a confession of weakness. When we think we are strong, we assume that we cannot be tempted. That is true, to a certain point. But, Satan is sly and even if we feel strong, sin can slip in on us if we are not careful.

Thousands of Protestants and Catholics have their check lists of sins they do not violate. However, it is like the Messianic Teacher that said about the Baptist minister, "the Baptist minister has his list of Clean and Unclean things he will or will not eat. It is just not the same list God gave man!

(**Repentance**, Continued from Page 9.) God's Grace. But God will not suspend the consequences of the sin, or we might never learn that sin has a price.

SIN COST GOD, THE LIFE OF HIS SON.

I personally spent my life eating too much salt and other things that probably weren't healthy for me. Plus, I was born under the curse of my father, grandfather, etc. I reaped from my heritage and from what I sowed. This all affected the health of my heart. Thankfully, I get to cry "ABBA FATHER, FORGIVE ME, I HAVE SINNED".

Now, I must adjust my actions more perfectly to fit into His Way, His Word. In my weakness, I see God's Strength. I now see it as a blessing to me, that God chose NOT TO suspend the curse and consequences of generations of sins, I reaped. Now, I can See God, much clearer.

It was NOT A MATTER OF "MY FAITH" being weak. It never was. I did not really understand the parable of the MUSTARD SEED, and other scriptures, so I thought it was my weak faith keeping me from healing.

And we must remember that God created the garden and we have spoiled it by our sins. Now, we are training for that day when we will get to help restore it, and also help to restore MANKIND, to God. But only when it is God's time. Until then, we need to repent daily and learn His ways. REMEMBER ISAIAH 55:8-9. We have the opportunity to learn how to think like God thinks if we desire it and put for the effort. And the best part is, we will one day get to teach others to do the same thing. END
